

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

**We are encouraged by your interest in Perimeter Christian School.
These are the steps to follow in submitting your application for admission.**

Step 1

Submit all parts of the completed application together with the required fees. A completed application will include these items:

- Application for Admission
- Student questionnaire completed in student's own handwriting (grades 6-8)
- Application Fee - \$120.00 (non-refundable)
- Listen to the Perimeter School Philosophy CD
- Obtain and read a copy of When Children Love to Learn by Elaine Cooper. Both parents (if both are current guardians) must read this book. Copies are available at bookstores or in the school office.
- Attend a scheduled Inside Perimeter School Class (both parents must attend)
- Turn in Discipline Policy, Pro-Life Position, Parent Contract & Beliefs Documents (both parents must sign)
- Recent photo of applicant

Step 2

Give the **Church Reference form** to a staff member of your church who knows your family well. There is a separate **Church Reference form** for students in the 6th–8th grade, to be given to a youth pastor or leader. **These completed reference forms should be mailed directly to PCS.**

Step 3

Give the **Family Reference forms** to 2 Christian adults (from different families) who know your family well (current PCS families preferred). **These completed reference forms should be mailed directly to PCS.**

Step 4

Give the **Teacher Reference form** and the **Request for Records** to the student's school. The school is to complete the reference form and attach a photocopy of school records and health records. **The school should return these directly to PCS.**

Step 5

When we have received the completed application and fee, testing may be scheduled for the next available testing date.

Step 6

When the Admissions Office has received all of the above materials, you may be scheduled for a family admissions interview. An interview with the Middle School Principal may also be arranged for all Middle School applicants

Beliefs

Doctrinal Standards of the Covenant School

The following beliefs are foundational to the operation of Perimeter School and are espoused by all covenant family members as part of their commitment to the school.

Beliefs

1. We believe the Bible alone is God's infallible and authoritative Word to man. It is the only standard by which faith and practice are to be measured.
2. We believe in the inspiration and inerrancy of the 66 books making up the entire Holy Scriptures.
3. We believe God is a triune God – the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
4. We believe in the majesty and sovereignty of God.
5. We believe that God spoke and purposefully created the universe out of nothing.
6. We believe that God created men in His image. Through their relationship to Adam, all men are sinners by nature and do themselves practice sin. They are thus alienated from God, their neighbor and the world.
7. We believe that at the fall this image was broken, resulting in man's total depravity.
8. We believe in God's gracious plan of redemption, as described in The Old and New Testament.
9. We believe that Jesus Christ is the only Savior of sinners, the only way to the Father. He died as a substitute for sinners and was raised from the dead so that they might be reconciled to God.
10. We believe that eternal life is a free gift that is received through faith in Jesus alone. Eternal life is neither deserved by anyone, nor can it be earned by good deeds.
11. We believe that God applies the salvation earned by Jesus Christ to man through the Holy Spirit.
12. We believe that persons not under the covenant of God's saving grace are condemned to a literal place of eternal punishment and separation from God. God's word reveals that there will be a final judgment of man the consequences of which lead either to heaven or hell.
13. We believe that the chief end of man is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever.
14. We believe children of believing parents are rightly called "covenant" children, thereby receiving special benefits from God exclusive of salvation.
15. We believe in the priority of the church and the necessity of local church membership by believers.
16. We believe that a representative form of government is the most Biblical and practical way to operate a covenant school.
17. We believe that God's Word clearly condemns homosexuality and abortion as sinful activities and are not considered alternate lifestyles or life choices that should be embraced or taught as acceptable behavior.
18. We believe that in doctrinal issues there must be unity in the essentials and love in the non-essentials.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

The word "discipline" means to make a disciple. This involves both the intrinsic and extrinsic aspects of teaching a child to live properly before God and in all spheres of life. A change in heart (intrinsic) is accomplished only by prayer; but structure, boundaries, and consequences help develop habits of discipline.

1. **Unacceptable Attitudes And Behaviors:**

Behaviors that lie outside the acceptable boundaries of Perimeter School include the following:

- a. Any action that interferes with the learning process of the child and his classmates. This includes any alteration of one's appearance in order to distract other students.
- b. Any action that would possibly cause physical or emotional harm to the child, his classmates, or his instructors. This would include bringing to school any weapon or any other object that could be used as such.
- c. Any action that is in direct violation of an established school rule or procedure (cheating, fighting, stealing, interrupting, disruption, or leaving campus.)
- d. Any action of willful disrespect toward his classmates, his teacher or any adult authority.
- e. A willful failure to complete assigned work in a reasonable amount of time.
- f. A use of language that is profane, blasphemous, or unduly crude.

2. **Responsibility Of The Parents:**

As an extension of the home, school discipline should reinforce the rules and consequences of the parents as much as possible. Where possible, parents are part of the decision regarding proper consequences for unacceptable behavior. Parents commit to giving the school teacher authority to exercise discipline in their place. In a covenant school, parents must sometimes defer to the consequences given to their child (even if it is not what they might have chosen) in trust that the overall purpose of God's work is being accomplished.

3. **Responsibility Of The Teacher:**

Individual teachers, for the most part, will handle discipline in accordance with school policy in their own way in harmony with their own methods and abilities. This could be any one of many different things, ranging from reprimand to corporal punishment. These could include, but are not limited to, cleaning up a room or writing an essay. We encourage the teachers to have the corrective measure fit the offense. More serious cases will be referred to the administration. An attitude of prayer for true repentance must undergird all actions.

4. **Use Of Corporal Punishment:**

Corporal punishment (spanking on a child's bottom with a paddle) may be administered by the teacher or principal depending on the severity and/or frequency of the student's offense(s). These incidents are reported to parents (ahead of time if possible) and an adult witness is always present. Other methods of punishment are used with female students in grades 6-8. If excessive discipline problems continue, suspension and ultimately, if necessary, expulsion will occur.

5. **Unacceptable Behavior Outside Of School:**

Students whose behavior outside of school is unlawful or immoral, will be subject to disciplinary action by the school and subject to expulsion.

6. **Behavioral Probation:**

Students with continual instances of unacceptable behavior may be placed on a behavioral probation for a designated length of time to allow repentance and restitution. Violation of such probation will result in expulsion from the school. The details of such probation will be clearly communicated to both parents and the student.

PERIMETER CHURCH'S PRO-LIFE POSITION

We, the Officers of Perimeter Church, wish to have it known that:

1. In agreement with the PCA Report on Abortion, we believe that there is no biblical grounds for abortion.
2. In response to the often-raised exceptional cases such as:
 - a) certainty of mental retardation of the child,
 - b) certainty of deformity of the child,
 - c) pregnancy by rape,
 - d) pregnancy by incest,

we say that, even here, all life is sacred and meaningful in the eyes of God, and that these unborn children have as much right to life as any other human being.

3. To the objection, "what if the life of the mother is threatened?" we say that is not a valid reason for aborting the child, as we believe that this position leaves too much room for arbitrary termination of an unborn life.
4. We believe that in the rare case in which there looms the certain death of the mother during pregnancy, premature delivery of the yet unborn child may be necessary in order to save the life of the mother. In the unlikely (if even possible) situation that saving the life of one means the certain death of the other, we believe priority should be given to preserving the life with the greatest potential of survival. Every effort to preserve the life of both mother and child should be made.
5. In the final analysis, we submit to a loving and sovereign God, who is the author of life and death, for His wisdom in who lives and dies.
6. We also believe that for those who have had an abortion in the past and are repentant, there is grace and forgiveness with God. Christ's death is sufficient for all the sins of His people, and we rejoice in His promise that "if we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (I John 1:9) We at Perimeter Church also have a forgiving and conciliatory attitude toward those who have suffered through this tragic event and now demonstrate true repentance.

Our signatures below indicate that we have read, do understand, and do agree with the Parent Contract. In making application to attend Perimeter Christian School,

1. We do affirm our commitment to a **biblical view of parenting** which includes:
 1. Our ultimate responsibility to educate our children according to Deut. 6: 6,7.
 2. Our submission to the authority of Jesus Christ, the leadership of our church, and civil authorities.
 3. Our regular practices of spiritual growth that include personal, family, and corporate devotion and worship.
2. We do affirm our commitment to the **educational philosophy of Perimeter School** which includes:
 1. Allowing the school to assist us in the individual education of our child.
 2. Submitting to the school-wide policies governing all students.
 3. Praying regularly for all the school staff, the faculty, and other school families.
3. We do affirm our commitment to **parent and student punctual attendance requirements at school functions** which include: school-wide campus meetings, teacher conferences, class parent meetings, regular school days, and enrichment days (including field trips and service projects). Non-compliance may jeopardize re-enrollment.
4. We do affirm our commitment to **teaching and chaperoning enrichment days and field trips** as is required and stated in the Student Handbook for our child's grade level and class.
5. We do affirm our commitment to a **biblical model of communication** which includes:
 1. Following requested channels of concerns or criticisms by going first to the appropriate party (teacher, principal, etc.).
 2. Refraining from giving bad reports or gossiping about issues with others.
 3. Bringing constructive suggestions to the administration or School Ministry Team in writing.
 4. Letting the administration know if the school's commitment to competent teaching, solid curriculum, regular feedback, proper supervision, cooperation with the home, and love and respect for your child is not being met.
6. We do affirm our commitment to **giving the teachers and principals full discretion in disciplining our children** which includes:
 1. Praise as well as rebuke.
 2. Spanking for serious offenses under careful, appropriate guidelines.
 3. Expulsion from school if behavior warrants such.
7. We do affirm our commitment to **being responsible for assuring our child's compliance with school rules or withdrawing him**, which includes the recognition that the school retains the final word on a student's discipline, suspension, probation, or expulsion.
8. We do affirm our commitment to **accepting the breadth and scope of Perimeter School's program**, realizing that the school cannot meet the educational needs of all covenant children. The school retains the right, after careful testing and examination, to deny admission or re-enrollment to any student whose needs are not best met by its program. This may include required outside tutoring or therapy in order for a student to be enrolled.

9. We do affirm our commitment to the school as **a non-profit ministry of Perimeter Church** which includes:
1. Recognizing that members of Perimeter Church are given enrollment priority if other admissions standards are met.
 2. Recognizing the school's need for faith giving beyond the required tuition to help fund teacher emergency needs, scholarships for students, and special capital expenditures.
 3. Recognizing the school's submission overall to the authority of the Session of Perimeter Church.
10. We affirm our commitment that once the parents' contract has been signed and the enrollment fee paid, **we are responsible for paying the full tuition and fees for the academic year.** Because the school's expenses are incurred on an annual basis, the school cannot release the parents from their financial obligation. Extenuating circumstances may be appealed in writing to the School Ministry Team. Should the vacancy created by a family's withdrawal be filled during the school year, the family may be released of their remaining financial obligation, subject to a review by the School Ministry Team. Records will not be forwarded to another school until all financial obligations have been satisfied.

Delinquent accounts will result in:

1. Late fees on all tuition and fee payments.
2. Transcripts of student records withheld until payment is made.
3. Eighth graders not participating in graduation until account is paid in full.
4. Loss of enrollment priority for the following year.
5. Removal from school if the account falls two or more months in arrears.

Perimeter School reserves the right to refuse any application, or dismiss any child at any time, for unacceptable work or conduct, or any other reason it deems necessary. Neither this application nor payment of fees is considered to be binding upon Perimeter School.

If legal action is required to collect tuition, the undersigned will be responsible to pay reasonable attorney fees.
